## Ask yourself the following questions to help you choose appropriate activities for your group and context:

How do the activities relate to your intended learning outcomes?
Are there activities that relate to all learning outcomes?
How will you scaffold and sequence activities to help participants learn the
content over time?
How will you design a variety of activities, including for individual work, pairs, small
and large-group work?
How can all activities be inclusive of all participants?
How will activities draw knowledge from everyone?
Are there elements of both quiet, independent thinking and group collaboration
in the selection of activities?
Can you build in choice related to activities (e.g., allow people to work individually
or in a group)?
Will the activities be meaningful, interesting, and motivating to participants?
What level of trust will the group need to have built together in order to fully engage
in the activities?
$Will the \ activities \ be \ comfortable \ for \ participants, \ yet \ gently \ challenge \ them \ if \ desired?$
Are the activities authentic, close to what people would do in real life as much
as possible?
Are the activities ones that you feel comfortable with and able to facilitate?
Do you have the supplies and resources to support the activities?
Do you have enough time for the group to meaningfully participate in the activities
you've chosen?
